HAIR STYLE



Ponytails are a great standard that you have so many options with! You can rock a simple, sleek finished pony or dress it up with a side part and volume. (Note: Side parts are STILL in this Spring for ponys!) The always trendy chignon is also an option- low and messy...but with texture this season!



To achieve a wet look finished pony, prep wet hair with a heavy blow dry lotion like Redken Velvet Gelatine® combined with TUBC Natural Hold Styling Gel for optimum hold and shine. Blow dry hair about 75% dry with a large Paddle Brush to create a smooth texture. Apply a shine product like TUBC Shine Serum mixed with a heavy shiny gel like TUBC Extra Hold Styling Gel on almost dry hair from base to ends generously to achieve high sheen and the wet look. Use the paddle brush to smooth hair back toward the direction your final pony will be. If the hair is really dense, you may want to work in sections starting with brushing the nape into your hands and work upward for maximum control. Use a finishing product like Redken Forceful 23® Hairspray and a generous amount of Vinyl Glam® to complete your look and add extra "wetness".

To play on the trendy and polished side braid or side pony and stay on trend with the wet look, try a smooth and polished side pony with a pop of texture using a side braid! Prep wet hair with a heavy blow dry lotion like Redken Velvet Gelatine® blended with a gel product like TUBC Natural Hold Styling Gel for the optimum sleek look. Blow dry hair about 75% dry and follow styling directions for the wet pony. Before you style and secure the pony, take a small section in front (or wherever you'd like to add interest!) and create a French braid or fish tail. Once completed, begin to smooth and secure hair to the side including the braid. Always remember to work with your guest's face shape. Use a finishing product like Redken Forceful 23® Hairspray and a generous amount of Vinyl Glam® to complete your look and add extra "wetness".

Working with waves and texture gives us the opportunity to create fun styles that can be structured! Waves are really always in season- trends change a bit from

season to season, but they're always fashionable. Don't be afraid again to put some volume in there- volume with waves is all the rage for Spring 2011!



To achieve an undone look but maintain some structure and volume, start with a heavy blow dry lotion or gel for lasting hold and strength like TUBC Styling Lotion mixed with Redken Satinwear® for hold and shine. Use your fingers and blow dry the hair being sure to "scrunch" around the mid- strands to create the rough effect. Use a round brush and blow dry the crown using an overdirected base control for volume. Use a curling or flat iron to add defined waves where desired for a more structured look. Finish this style with a pomade for shine and hold like TUBC Texturizing Cream blended with TUBC Humidifying Styling Balm and work through ends to base creating hold and shine. For a different look, pull finished waves back in a loose pony! Finish style and use Redken Forceful 23® for hold.

HAIR CUTS



For haircuts this spring, the bob is STILL back but in a longer version- shoulder length (straight or wavy). This cut works on virtually every face shape and allows for multiple looks and styles. Straight or wavy- rock it out!



Also try a Collarbone Cut with light layering. This also works well on most face shapes and allows for versatility!



For those short hair lovers, the choppy pixie is still always in with a little rock disheveling like Halle Berry. Or for a more punk and deconstructed look, go for an Undercut Bowl shape like Ginnifer Goodwin!

HAIR COLOR

For haircolor this Spring, Tracey Cunningham with Redken talks about reds, brunettes and blondes.



Trend #1: Brunettes

The beautiful chestnut brown, seen on Jennifer Lopez, will be huge in the Spring and Summer months. A great base with shine and vitality with some beautiful light highlights close to the face creates an amazing glow. Also, the ombré style will be another great transition into summer for brunettes, with the gradation of color as it gets lighter towards the ends. As the weather warms up, even brunettes like to brighten up their color – it won't get too dark or dull!



Trend #2: Redheads

The reds moving into Spring will be really strong and vibrant. Emma Stone loves to play with different shades of red, but always has a really strong base of deep, almost burgundy color that gives her that extra sass and personality. Redheads will definitely trend in this direction!

Trend #3: Blondes



As we move into Spring/Summer of 2011, the ombré style will be extremely prevalent with the blondes. Like with Drew Barrymore's look, the roots that fade into blonde gives her a natural summer beach feel.

MAKEUP



Slight change in the trend we have been seeing since winter. For Spring 20 11 we are keeping the bold lip color but using shades of orange and coral. This bold coral lip color can be achieved by mixing the following: .25+.25+.125 Paprika, .125+.25 Red Red, .125+.125 Coral, .125 Marigold,.25+.125 Tangerine, .125 Flame and 1 drop Mahogany in a Crème Base.



We are seeing rich shades of violet eyeliner and eye shadow being used. You can use this color to simply line the eyes or bring it out to the crease to give a smoky effect. A great violet eye shadow shade can be achieved by mixing the following: ½ tsp. Tourmaline, ½ tsp. Lapis and 1/8 tsp. Moonlight Pearl. (If a more matte shade is desired do not add the Moonlight Pearl).



In the past we have seen a nude look in makeup, but this spring we are seeing colorful cheek colors. Apply bright shades of pinks and corals to the apples of the cheeks. This bright pink coral blush can be achieved by mixing the following: 1 tsp. Medium MP, ½ + 1/8 Tourmaline, ¼ Sunstone and 1/8 Sunlight Gold.



Super pigmented pastels are also a trend we are seeing. From the pink lips pictured to pastel blues and oranges for the eyes. This super pastel pink lip gloss can be achieved by mixing: .375 + .25 White, .25 Magenta, .125 + 1 drop Sapphire and Butter Base.



Metallic shadows are also popular this spring. Use them in lighter shades to add light and openness to the eyes or darker shades for a smokier look. To achieve this metallic silver shadow look mix the following: $\frac{3}{4}$ tsp. Silver, $\frac{1}{4}$ Moonlight Pearl.



Smoky eyes are still popular but we are seeing the addition of colorful bright shades and not just dark. In this example we see they are inserting the metallic trend to the smoky eye. Use the metallic silver color from above along with your dark to achieve this look.

CATCHING UP WITH:

Taylor Smith



Taylor became interested in the skin care industry as soon as she started considering what career would make her happy. Taylor decided to join Tricoci's esthetics program in 2008 and since has been growing in the industry. With the amount of success she has had, she realized, you can really do anything you set

your mind to if you really want it and pursue it.

When starting at TUBC, Taylor knew she wanted to be an esthetician but she didn't realize how much work it would be. She thought she would do some facials here and there and make it along, but was pleasantly surprised by the elaborate detail and quality in the education. The product titled "vitamin veil" was a facial moisturizer that neutralized free radicals with a low level of glycolic acid and vitamins to help the skin steer clear of the pollutants in the environment. She was also able to promote this product as an excellent base before a makeup application.

Taylor is currently working at Sleek Surgical Center and Med Spa on 5th Ave. in New York City. She is the lead esthetician at this location and has been able to do a wide variety of services including but not limited to pre and post lipo procedures, skin tightening, and facials.

Taylor's advice to people starting out in the beauty industry: "With cosmetology, esthetics or anything you do in life, it doesn't matter how many people have done it before you or have already accomplished your dreams – If you want it, you can be the same or better as long as you continue to be passionate about what you do." She said that although things can be discouraging, you have to always be willing to learn, grow and stay positive to be successful. "The most passionate person wins!"
